Like most groups, Broughton Dramatic Society have had to pause it's activities as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The group are now back to the rehearsal room planning their April production of The LadyKillers by Graham Linehan, based on the 1955 comedy film of the same name. The play features and eccentric old widow who rents rooms in her house to some interesting guests. It will showcase at the Village Hall from 28th - 30th April.

Broughton Runners

Broughton Runners was started about 5 years ago and has established a vibrant running community since then. It is this group that created the Broughton Burn and the newer Colour Burn event, which is a fun colour run coming in June 2022. They regularly meet on a Sunday morning for social runs.

The Group is very active and always have a few things going on. They currently have a challenge series that the members are participating in which spans 4 months. It started in November with an elevation challenge, which basically means they have to run up a lot of hills until they reach a target elevation. In December, their next challenge is to run enough miles to hit a mileage target. The next challenge, in January, is to club together to hit a group mileage target. Then, finishing in February the last challenge is to attempt to hit a PB on a distance of their choice 5km, 10km half marathon etc.

The group has just started what they call 'Punishment Monday's' which take place on Mondays at around 6pm. These sessions are when club coach Steve Portess pushes the members to their limits. Strangely enough this day has become very popular! I guess runners are glutens for punishment.

Also, a recent addition to the clubs portfolio is runners strength and conditioning workouts which take place on Sunday evenings at 6pm. These sessions are good for anyone but are more focused on running strength as opposed to HIIT workouts that focus on all round fitness and toning.

Broughton through the years

In modern day Northern Lincolnshire Lycra clad men and women often traverse our country roads on the latest, stylish road bike. Whether they are travelling to work or enthusiastically keeping fit or evening looking to emulate our hugely successful Team GB Olympic cyclists they are revitalising an age old local pursuit.

Way back 120 years ago men and and women of this parish, pictured below, formed a cycling club under the presidency of Mr Wyatt (Rev. William). Mr Young acting Secretary and Mr Lupton as treasurer with Messrs Ayre, Mann, Codd and Johnson as committee members.

The Midsummer festival held in early August 1901 was extremely wet so the sports scheduled for the Monday and Tuesday were postponed until the Wednesday 'half-day'. The cycling events as usual were very well attended. By 1903 the Midsummer sports events had many interesting formats such as the 'One Mile Handicap' the 'Half Mile Handicap' and an Obstacle Race. Competitors came from Hull, Walkeringham, Alkborough, Brumby, Scunthorpe and Grimsby to compete in the events. Although the reports disappointingly don't suggest any female competitors took place in the Midsummer events.

Cycling wasn't the only Olympic sport taking place in Broughton in August 1903. Elwood Parish won the Walking Match. 8 1/2 Miles from Ye Olde Thatch Inn to the Wheatsheaf in Hibaldstow(e) and back again.

A golden age of Sport in Broughton had begun.
