Awards for the Broughton Rec Grounds Team

Broughton Community and Sports Association (BCSA) have been maintaining Broughton Recreation Field for nearly 4 years.

Before we started the field was in a very poor state as identified by professionals in an FA pitch inspection report.

The site had been neglected for years and was also badly affected by the chafer grubs and associated damage by birds feeding on them. We could only manage to mark out 1 5v5 football pitch on the whole 3.8-hectare site!

With the support of the Grounds Management Association, Lincolnshire FA, and Broughton Town Council we set off on a mission to improve the site. We were successful in gaining a grant from the Football Foundation and fundraised over £6,000 to help us and Broughton Town Council to purchase the recommended machinery to help us.

Further to this BCSA was then successful in gaining a 10-year grant from the Football Foundation to help us do the recommended extra maintenance works on the site. This is a further investment in the site of over £110,000 over the 10-year period!

BCSA has committed to spending £11,500 a year on the site. We have now entered year 3 of this grant process. The Football Foundation's grant tapers down: in years 1 & 2 we received 100% funding, in years 3 & 4 we receive 67%, in years 5 & 6 we will receive 33%. In years 7, 8, 9 & 10 BCSA will be funding it all ourselves.

In just 3 years of being on the FA's pitch improvement program, we have turned the site around. We now boast 8 football pitches! After our first pitch inspection back in 2019, all the pitches were classed as "poor". After our last inspection earlier this year ALL bare 1 of our pitches was classed as "good" with some areas even classed as advanced! The area still classed as poor is the floodlit training area which sits on the subbase of the old tennis courts and has a very thin layer of clay-based soil.



Because of our efforts, we have recently been awarded the Volunteer Grounds Team of the year by Lincolnshire FA. I, Pattrick Harrison (Chairman of Broughton Ravers JFC and volunteer grounds person), and Ian Hayes (a coach and volunteer grounds person) were honored to receive this award at the Lincolnshire FA's annual awards evening in Lincoln in October (photo attached).

But most notably I was very honored to represent us at the Grounds Management Association's National award ceremony at the NEC in Birmingham in November.

We had been shortlisted from 1000s nationally for the Volunteer Grounds Team/Individual of the year award. We only went and won it!!

This is a massive achievement for Broughton and the dedicated volunteers who spend hours of their "spare" time maintaining the site.

There is a group of about 15 of us from Broughton Ravers JFC and Broughton Cricket Club who give up our time. A huge thanks must go out to them and Broughton Town Council for their support along the way.

To top everything off we had the Football Foundation visit us on Saturday 5th November. They are using us for their promotional material nationally as a best practice case study. They filmed and interviewed several of us.

Watch this space we may be on the TV soon!

Several exciting events have taken place in Broughton this year and there are a number of achievements that we can be very proud of:

The Broughton Town Council Annual Civic Dinner took place on Saturday, 2 nd April. A raffle took place which was a huge success and £400 was raised for Brain Tumour Research.

The Broughton Agricultural Show took place in July which was enjoyed by residents of all ages. A Scarecrow Competition and Street Boot also took place on the same weekend. For the third year running, Broughton has won the Best Kept Small Town Award. A special thanks go out to all the groups involved in helping us receive this award. The introduction of the hanging baskets and kiosk have been well received. Ideas are welcome for next year!

A Best Kept Allotment Plot Competition took place during the Summer. Prizes were awarded to the Best Kept Small Plot and Best Kept Large Plot. A competition for the Best Kept Garden also took place with prizes being awarded to the first, second and third-place winners.

Broughton Town Council joined the rest of the country in paying its respects to Queen Elizabeth II in September following her very sad passing after a historic 70-year reign. Local residents were able to sign a Book of Condolences at the Village Hall.

The 10th Anniversary Celebration of the opening of the Ivan Glover Library, formally the Broughton Jubilee Library took place in September. Our Mayor, Councillor Louise Price met with the volunteers and presented Margaret Howe with some flowers to thank her for organising the library rota for the last 10 years! Councillor Price was very pleased to see Ann Glover, the wife of late Councillor Ivan Glover whom the library was named after. Along with the late Councillor Arthur Bunyan, the two of them were instrumental in bringing a permanent library to Broughton again! Ann had not seen the new sign at the library and was very emotional when it was pointed out to her.

A Macmillan Coffee morning took place at the Village Hall on Saturday, 24th September. It was a great success and £555 was raised. Residents will soon be able to start making nominations for the Community Service Awards 2023 which recognize the achievements of those contributing to community life in Broughton. Look out for the nomination form on the Broughton Town Council Facebook page. Broughton Town Council are currently progressing with a community grant to install outside gym equipment on the playing field adjacent to the play area. This will be available for all residents to utilise.

Broughton Town Council congratulates BCSA on their recent national ground maintenance award. BCSA do a fantastic job at maintaining the playing field which is funded by the Town Council, The Football Foundation, and their own fund-raising events. The Town Council continues to support BCSA and all the volunteers that carry out this work.

Broughton through the years

2023 represents 75 years since the reformation of the cricket club following the Second World War. Since in it's inaugural year not much cricket was actually played and since it's 50th year was most definitely one to forget I thought we would focus on 1973.

In 1973 Fred Honness chaired the meetings, Herbert Duffill was the treasurer and Bryan Simpson the secretary. The main source of Income was the Tote Double (£797 for the year) ran by Gerald Denton and Bryan Simpson.

Expenditures were £15 rent to the parish council, £24 annual umpire fees, Mowers £54, Travel £46, Insurance £9 and other sundry expenses such as League fees. The balance in hand was £2004, a princely sum in 1973.

The parish council made arrangements to cut the field every 11 days during the season and it was sprayed for weeds in early May. The pavilion, bought by the club in 1951 required extensive care on an annual basis. A basic facility, with no showers the club struggled to keep the building in a decent state. The chairman suggested, at the annual general meeting held in March that the club do as little to the pavilion as possible, the Parish council were proceeding with plans for a new one.

Teas were covered by Mrs Simpson, Mrs Smith (Ann) and Mrs Graves. The cost to the players would be 18p per game.

Captain for North Lindsey League matches was Fred Graves, for Broughton Evening League games was Gerald Denton and for friendly matches was Barry Smith.

George Armstrong's area of responsibility was the pavilion, Reg Welton monitored playing gear, Tom Hopewell looked after the maintenance of the mowers and Dave Simpson the annual subscriptions which were 50p per year for players in work, 25p for those not and 10p for a member under the age of 18.

The Intermediate side (under-18s) was set up and had elected to play in the Scunthorpe League for 1973, Neil Fisher had first got a group of players together from the village and Brigg Grammar to play some friendly matches against Bishop Norton and Kirton Lindsey in August 1972. Many of these members had attended the 1973 AGM.

This 25th year was celebrated with a dinner at the Village Hall in the autumn and paved the way for the future development of the club. The North Lindsey League side finished 3rd in the league that year, their highest ever finish. The Intermediates were runners up and losing KO Cup Finalists in the Scunthorpe League.

In 1974 the club applied for membership of the Lincolnshire League, losing out to Messingham as well as entering a second team in the North Lindsey League. In 1975 the club had a bumper year winning a North Lindsey League and Cup double and the Intermediates won their league. And finally in 1976 the club gained membership to the Lincolnshire County League which was essential for the development of young players within the club. The clubs rise through those lower Lincolnshire leagues was based on the strong foundations laid in 1973.
